ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1 Tents

All troops booking in will be asked to list their tents. Leaders are requested not to allow scouts to camp in individual hike tents but rather to camp as patrols in 6 man tents. Sites will be allocated by numbers and camp areas and a diagram of the campsite will be issued to indicate your site.

2 Trailers

Trailers will be allowed on sites during the camp but sizes must be provided on the booking form.

3 Traffic

There are two site access available. Entrance A will be at the lay by just off Junction 4 of the M180. Entrance B will be at the Kirton Road entrance off the A18 into Scunthorpe. Each Troop will be allocated an entrance with a directional map with the acknowledgement of their booking.

4 Car/ Mini Bus Parking.

Car Parking will be on the rides into the camp site. Leaders are asked not to park their cars sideways but rather alongside each other. Please ensure when parking your car it does not obstruct the ride.

5. Cars on Campsite

Cars will not be allowed on the campsite during the camp. Cars will be clear of the site by 2000 on Friday and will be allowed on the sites at 1400 on Sunday.

6 Toilets

Primrose Hill is a designated Greenfield Campsite non permit holders are covered by the Camp Chief. There are no flush toilets or showers so its back to basics. Troops will require Chemical Toilets with tents for the camp. There is a cess pit for emptying toilets.

7 Water.

There are several taps situated around the site however you may want to bring some method of transport for carrying.

8 Waste Management

There will be two skips available, please ensure all waste is bagged up and tied prior to depositing them in the skip

9 First Aid

First Aid will be provided however we would expect minor injuries to be dealt with by the leaders on a first response basis.

10. Risk Assessments

We assume that camp leaders will conduct their own risk assessments in accordance with Scout Rules.

11 Wet Pits

Wet Pits are allowed however they must be dug 10 metres into the woods and not on footpaths or rides. After filling they must be marked with a wooden cross

12 Cubs

Cubs can attend however they must be ten plus years of age.

Activities

It would be appreciated if each participating troop could bring an activity to do on their campsite. This would be of great assistance to keep the children going for the whole weekend.
