

Kit Update

Kit we said we would provide:

- 1 holdall bag
- 8 t-shirts
- 1 hoodie
- 1 UK necker
- 1 Austria badge
- 1 UK badge

Additional kit we have managed to include!

- 3 extra Austria badges each
- 1 water bottle
 (that will last the week)
- 1 Austria branded cup (that you will get to keep)
- Passport holder and Sub
 Camp coloured lanyard







Austria Kit List



Personal Kit - Going inside your holdall that has been provided.

Everything must be clearly marked with the young person's name; it is inevitable that we will find something that does not belong to anybody at some point during the camp. With this in mind, it may be useful if young people are encouraged to pack their own bags.

Clothing needs to be appropriate and practical for the event, it really is not a fashion parade. If you can see up it, down it or through it, it is not suitable to be worn on camp!

- Current Cub/Scout/Explorer/Leader Uniform top
- Sufficient changes of clothes for the week
 - Long trousers
 - o Shorts
 - o Underwear
 - o Socks
 - Austria t-shirts These will be worn during the day. You will travel there and back in your Sub Camp's colour.
 - Tops To wear on an evening.
 - Austria Hoodie You may bring another jumper as well if you wish, it will likely be warm at this time of year in Austria.
- Pyjamas
- Waterproofs Coat and trousers
- 2 pairs of shoes You can be wearing one and you will need some suitable to walk across wet grass in the morning.
- 2 towels One for activities and one for washing.
- Wash kit Including shower gel and brush / comb these will be used!
- Hat Sun protection is as important.
- Swimming clothes
- · Torch and batteries Consider spares if required.
- Spare glasses If worn and available.
- Sunglasses
- Sun cream (minimum factor 30) We would recommend spray suncream where possible.
- Any appropriate medication to last for the week This should stay in your holdall during travel and then it must be handed in when we arrive at the campsite.

All electronics are brought at your own risk and there are no charging facilities available.

Personal Kit - Outside of your holdall.

- · Sleeping Bag With your coloured identity tag attached (supplied in your holdall bag).
- Roll Mat With your coloured identity tag attached (supplied in your holdall bag).
- Tent Your Group will have arranged who you are sharing with and who will be responsible for bringing the tent to the coach pick up point.

You won't need anything else outside of your holdall, which will be evident when you get to Austria, as it won't be loaded on the coach.

Personal Kit - To take in the coach with you or in your day bag.

Your day bag is not provided, please bring your own sensible sized rucksack.

- Lanyard and passport holder, containing your passport and GHIC card This should be around your neck when you board your first coach. No passport, no travel.
- Austria t-shirt You must be wearing this in the colour of your Sub Camp.
- Austria Necker You must be wearing this.
- Austria Hoodie You may need this when getting off the coach for toilet breaks during the night.
- Spending money No more than £50 in Euros, or on a card such as a Revolut card. Young people will be responsible for looking after and managing their own money throughout the trip.
- Packed breakfast and lunch This must be eaten before you leave the UK. The first meal we will provide will be your Sunday evening meal (on the ferry).
- Filled water bottle
- Pillow This is optional as you will need to sit with this on the coach, it won't go underneath.

Things you will not need:

- The kitchen sink!
- · Plates, dishes, knives, forks, spoons, tea towel, etc This will all be provided.
- Pen knives, or knives of any kind This includes multitool, Swiss army knives and similar items.
- Water pistols
- Electronic games, tablets, etc
- Lighters or matches
- Cigarettes or vapes of any kind are strictly prohibited for anyone under 18.
- · Anything that you would be upset about getting lost or broken.

Remember, everything that you bring, you must be able to carry by yourself.



Spending Money

- No more than €50
- On a cash card such as Revolut
- Some in cash campsite is cash only
- Young people will be responsible for looking after and managing their own money throughout the trip.



Travel Reminders



Arriving at your Bus Meeting Point

- Be on time.
- Wear a t-shirt (and hoodie) in the colour of your Sub Camp and your UK necker.
- Wear your coloured lanyard around your neck, with your passport and GHIC card inside.
- Check your luggage has all the correct coloured tags on, with your ID number on.



Arriving at your Bus Meeting Point

- 1. Load your holdall, sleeping bag, roll mat and tent (if you are responsible for carrying this), <u>under</u> the coach.
- Check-in with your Bus Lead. They will need to see your passport and GHIC card before you board the coach. No passport, no travel.
- 3. Say goodbye to those who have brought you!
- 4. Take your day sack and pillow inside the coach with you.



Arriving at the Central Meeting Point

- Everyone and all your kit will be taken off the coach you travelled there on.
- The same 8 coaches will be assigned their Sub Camp colour.
- Everyone and all their kit will then need to be loaded onto the correct Sub Camp bus.
 This will be made a lot easier if you know your ID number and the coloured tags on your items.



Arriving at the Central Meeting Point

- Sub Camp Leaders will check everyone's passports again, before you board your final coach.
- Whilst on the coach, young people's passports will be collected in and stored safely. They will be handed back out again as required at borders you pass through.
- Wave to Alan & Harvey as you set off on the rest of the journey!

- Unload your coach.
- Lunch will be provided centrally catered.
- Set up camp.
- Site familiarisation.
- Opening Ceremony at 7:30pm.

Programme Top Tips!



White Water Rafting

- Swim wear on underneath clothing.
- Towel and change of underwear in your day bag.
- Safety straps for glasses.



High Ropes

- Sporty and comfortable clothing is recommended. Austria t-shirt & your choice of shorts/trousers/leggings.
- Sturdy shoes must be worn.
- Long hair <u>must</u> be tied up. Remember a bobble!
- No loose items in pockets.



Water Park

- Cubicle changing area available here.
- Spending money café with drinks and snacks.
- You don't have to go in the water if you don't want to. Plenty of grass and sand to sit and relax on!



Salzwelten

- Warm clothing inside the mountain it is only about 8°C all year round.
- Sturdy shoes it is rocky in places inside.
- You will be given a coverall to wear before entering.
- Keep your tickets safe!



Hallstatt

- Bring a camera for the amazing views!
- You will go around in Groups, with an adult.



Rodelbahn

Code of Conduct

Young Person and Adult Code of Conduct



To ensure everyone has the best time possible, below are the expectations for the Event:

Expectations

- Have the adventure of a lifetime!
- Follow our <u>Scout Values</u> Integrity, Respect, Care, Belief & Co-operation.
- Follow all UK, local laws and site rules.
- Everyone should act and behave in line with our <u>Scouting policies</u>.
- Behave in a way that makes Humberside and UK Scouts proud.
- Scouting expects everyone to be treated with dignity and respect. There is no place for bullying.
- Use kind hands and kind words. Keep your hands, feet and other body parts to yourself.
- Follow all safety guidance given by Leaders, for all locations and activities.
- Report any worries or concerns to a Leader. If you are not happy with the response, please report it to another Leader.
- Sleep in your allocated tent.
- Electronic devices should only be used at appropriate times.
- Free time activities must be age appropriate and in line with our Scouting rules, values and UK law.
- No alcohol to be bought or consumed on site at Zellhof, when young people are on site.
- Knives, other than those provided, are not permitted on the event.

Failure to meet these expectations will result in an appropriate consequence, as outlined below:

Consequences

- A. **Minor misconduct**: A verbal warning will be given. The person may be asked to not take part in the rest of the activity.
- B. Repeated minor misconduct: The person will miss out on the next day's activities.
- C. Final warning for repeated minor misconduct: A conversation with members from the Core Team. For young people, this will also result in open communication with parents/carers.
- D. Major offence: The person will be sent home at the next available opportunity. For young people, parents/carers will be instructed to come and collect from the event at their own expense.


