Role Overview

As Kitchen Lead, you'll play a vital part in helping your Sub Camp thrive. You'll oversee catering for around 50 people, ensuring everyone enjoys great food and a welcoming, friendly atmosphere after a full day of adventure.

You'll work closely with your Sub Camp Team and be supported by them when they're on site. It's a hands-on role that blends planning, teamwork, and leadership – perfect for someone who enjoys creating good food, good fun, and good company.

Before the Trip

- Work with the central catering team to help plan and design menus that meet the needs of participants and volunteers.
- Get involved in equipment checks and preparation to understand what facilities will be available in Germany.
- Offer input on food ordering, storage, and allergy management.
- Join optional pre-event planning sessions – your ideas, experience, and enthusiasm will always be welcome.

During the Trip

- Take responsibility for your Sub Camp's catering during the day, including food ordering (from the central hub), preparation, cooking, and service.
- Maintain food hygiene and safety standards in line with Scouts' best practice.
- Adapt menus and meal timings around activity schedules and sub camp needs.
- Prepare meals for when the sub camp returns from off-site activities, ensuring everyone is well-fed and smiling.
- Manage food stocks and support your sub camp team as needed.
- Above all, help make sure everyone has fun – including the kitchen team!

After the Trip

- Support with equipment clean-down, packing and storage, ensuring everything is returned clean, dry, and ready for the next adventure.
- Contribute to debriefs and share learning for future events.

That Sounds Like a Lot of Hard Work...

It's true, events like this take teamwork and energy, but you won't be doing it alone. Every Kitchen Lead is part of a supportive event team, with other leaders and volunteers around to help when needed.
