Pre and Post the Main Event

Some volunteers will be needed to:

- Travel out a couple of days in advance to assist with site setup;
- Travel back a day or two later to assist with clearing the camp and loading kit etc;
- Help with transporting equipment to or from Germany.

These requirements do not form part of this role and will be shared across the wider Support Team. You can of course volunteer for these independently of this role, but no one will be automatically expected to take them on unless they're happy to do so.

Role Overview

As part of the General Site Services Team, you'll help keep the camp running smoothly — supporting the operations team with whatever's needed to make each day a success. That might mean helping with food shopping or distribution, maintaining equipment, keeping facilities clean and functional, or just stepping in wherever an extra pair of hands is needed.

This is a varied and practical role that rewards flexibility and teamwork. One minute you might be delivering food supplies, the next tightening guy lines or replacing a gas bottle — it's all about making sure the camp runs efficiently and safely

Before the Trip

- Support the Operations Lead and Transport Lead as well as the wider team in checking, preparing, and testing equipment to make sure everything is safe and ready for transport.
- Assist in sourcing or repairing of kit where required.
- Take part in pre-event packing and loading, helping ensure we meet customs requirements.

During the Trip

- Adapt to the changing demands of the event — no two days will be the same!
- Help ensure all kit and equipment remain suitable, safe, and serviceable throughout the trip.
- Support with tent maintenance, equipment repairs, gas bottle changes, cooking, cleaning, (candlestick making probably won't feature!), or other practical site tasks as needed.
- Take turns working in the Food Distribution Centre, helping prepare, issue, and manage supplies for sub camps.
- Assist with customs requirements prior to leaving Germany, ensuring everything is packed, checked, and accounted for.
- Work closely with Deputy Sub Camp Leaders and the Transport Lead to make sure nothing is left behind and all equipment returns home safely.

After the Trip

- Help ensure all kit is cleaned, dried, repaired or replaced as needed, and safely stored.
- Support with any post-event inventories or logistics tasks.
- Contribute to post-event debriefs helping shape improvements for next time.

That Sounds Like a Lot of Hard Work...

It's true, events like this take teamwork and energy, but you won't be doing it alone. Every Welfare Team Member is part of a supportive event team, with other leaders and volunteers around to help when needed.

You'll have help from your colleagues during busy times, and opportunities to join in the fun yourself throughout the week. Everyone is able to enjoy at least one night off during the event to relax, unwind, or enjoy time with friends from across the event.
