Pre and Post the Main Event

Some volunteers will be needed to:

- Travel out a couple of days in advance to assist with site setup;
- Travel back a day or two later to assist with clearing the camp and loading kit etc;
- Help with transporting equipment to or from Germany.

These requirements do not form part of this role and will be shared across the wider Support Team. You can of course volunteer for these independently of this role, but no one will be automatically expected to take them on unless they're happy to do so.

Role Overview

As a Sub Camp Leader, you'll take overall responsibility for leading your sub camp of around 50 people, including young participants and adult volunteers. You'll be the key link between the event leadership team and your sub camp, ensuring everything runs smoothly from departure to return.

Your role is about building team spirit, maintaining welfare and motivation, and creating an environment where everyone can thrive. You'll oversee day-to-day coordination, manage minor issues such as first aid or behaviour, and keep your team informed and engaged.

Above all, this is about leadership through teamwork – sharing responsibility, supporting others, and helping everyone have an amazing time on this international adventure.

Before the Trip

- Develop and get to know your sub camp team.
- Arrange social activities (within the allocated budget) to help build relationships before departure.
- Help with kit preparation, equipment testing, packing, and logistics.
- Join pre-event planning and briefing sessions to stay connected and up to date.

During the Trip

- Lead your sub camp from the moment you board the bus until you return home.
- Oversee the successful running of the sub camp, working closely with your Kitchen Manager, Deputy Sub Camp Leader, and Programme Lead.
- Involve and empower the volunteers within your sub camp, ensuring they get the most from their experience.
- Support the welfare and inclusion of all young people and volunteers.
- Attend regular sub camp leader meetings and share updates or key information with your team.
- Maintain high spirits, manage day-to-day organisation, and ensure everyone has fun.

After the Trip

- Support with equipment clean-down and packing away to make sure everything is ready for future adventures.
- Thank your teams and celebrate their contributions.
- Take part in post-event reflections or debriefs to share feedback and ideas for improvement.

It's true, events like this take teamwork and energy, but you won't be doing it alone. Every Sub Camp Leader is part of a supportive event team, with other leaders and volunteers around to help when needed.
