Personal Kit List

- T-shirts
- Trousers and shorts
- Underwear
- Socks + spare pairs
- Nightwear
- Trainers
- Waterproofs (coat & trousers)
- Warm jumper/hoodie x 2
- Camping chair
- Survival Bag
- Walking boots
(or similar sturdy, waterproof shoes)
- Sleeping Bag – warm enough for sleeping outside in a shelter
- Warm hat and gloves
- Wash kit
- Roll mat & pillow
- Plate, bowl, mug & cutlery
- Refillable water bottle
- Tea towel
- Torch & spare batteries
- Personal penknife
- Sun hat, sunglasses and sun cream
- A container to put your fire lighting kit in.
(A plastic takeaway tub would be ideal)
- Camp blanket – good as extra warmth on Saturday night in your shelters.

Any electronic devices are brought at your own risk. There will be no charging facilities available.

Personal penknives can be brought by Scouts, but these must only be used for an appropriate activity, as directed by an adult.

Use of them inappropriately or in an unsafe manner, will result in them being confiscated until the end of the event and returned to the parent/carer at collection on Sunday.

Note: No responsibility for the personal equipment/clothing and effects can be accepted by the organisers and The Scout Association does not provide automatic insurance cover in respect to such items.

Troop Kit List

We ask that each Troop provides their PLs and APLs with the following equipment, to use and share between them.

We recommend that they are involved in getting out/packing this equipment for the weekend, so they are familiar with what they are bringing and can ensure its safe return!

Transport of this equipment to and from the camp should be arranged by each Troop.

- Tents for all members attending
- Hammocks and tarps – If you have any in your Troop. If not, we will have some to share.
- Cooking equipment which should be at least:
 - 1 large billy
 - 1 smaller billy
 - 1 frying pan
 - Utensils

All cooking equipment should be suitable for cooking on open fires.

- Washing up bowls and cleaning supplies
- Water carrier
- Old tarps/plastic sheets, old ropes and other suitable shelter building materials
These should be good enough and big for Scouts to make a shelter that they can all sleep in on Saturday night and remain dry!
- Saw to cut firewood - Training will be given on the event for anyone new to using this tool.
No axes to be brought please.
- 2 Compasses to share between them

Any saws, brought by Troops, must only be used within a designated cutting area.

The Scouts will learn the best practise for setting these up on Saturday morning, before needing to use them on Saturday afternoon.
